Selen's creative inspiration stems from antiquity and the natural world, finding profound beauty in their weathered textures and time-worn character. These imperfections are practised as a counterbalance to our consumption-driven culture, offering a glimpse into simpler times. For Selen, the creative process is a continuous exploration of form and expression. She questions whether true creativity begins with a blank canvas or if it originates from a more primal place, seeking to give shape to something yet undiscovered.

ARTISTIC APPROACH

Central to her artistic philosophy is the concept of creating objects in flux, perpetually evolving towards their true essence. This pursuit led her to experiment with lightweight concrete panels, affording her greater flexibility and authenticity in her work. Selen revels in the imperfections inherent in her chosen medium, finding beauty in the cracks and crevices that emerge organically. She employs techniques such as rusting and crackling processes to imbue her creations with a sense of raw vitality, symbolizing the inherent vulnerability of life.

Her artistic vision extends beyond mere aesthetics, as she meticulously selects natural pigments sourced from locales such as Umbria, Siena, Bohemia, and Afghan lapis lazuli, charging her work with layers of meaning and authenticity.


